ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING

In Advent we watch and wait for Christ's coming!

We light candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, remembering the promises of God with prayer. Today we light this candle in hope.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is already the moment for you to wake from sleep. 


